The Stayton Community Food Bank, a non-profit organization, has been in existence since 1983 and continues to serve area residents who meet the 2017 Income Guidelines under The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP). The Stayton Community Food Bank is an equal opportunity provider.

Below are the 2017 Income Guidelines:

Family Size	Monthly Income	Annual Income
1	\$1,860	\$22,311
2	\$2,504	\$30,044
3	\$3,149	\$37,777
4	\$3,793	\$45,510
5	\$4,437	\$53,243
6	\$5,082	\$60,976
7	\$5,726	\$68,709
8	\$6,371	\$76,442

For each additional member, add \$645 per month or \$7,733 per year. You are also eligible to receive food from TEFAP if your household participates in any of the following programs:

- Low Income Home Energy Assistance (LIHEAP)
- Social Security Disability Income / Social Security Income (SSDI/SSI)
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) (Food Stamps)
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- Women, Infant and Children Supplemental Nutrition (WIC)
- Free or Reduced School Lunch Program
