Over the past 9 months, our community has raised approximately \$18,000 to fund a K9 program. It is with great excitement that we welcome the newest member of our Police Department, a 20 month old chocolate lab named Brodie. He officially became a member of the Stayton Police Department on May 13, 2013.

Brodie was raised and trained by Pacific Coast K9 training in Custer, WA. His handler is Stayton Police Officer Paul Eves who started with the department as a Reserve Officer in 2002, later becoming a full time Officer in 2010. Brodie lives with Officer Eves and his family.

Officer Eves and Brodie already make a great team, recently assisting in the arrest of several people on drug charges including a major search warrant.
