Stayton City Council Considers Rental Housing Code

Close to half of the homes in Stayton are renter occupied. While state law provides certain minimum standards for rental housing, these standards are somewhat general and do not provide a mechanism for enforcement by a municipality.



The City's Comprehensive Plan includes a policy to assure that all occupied housing units are safe, decent, and suitable for healthful habitation. The Comprehensive Plan includes the following Implementation Actions in regards to this policy:

- Enforcement of existing standards for health and safety
- Enactment of additional standards, as appropriate

As currently drafted, the Stayton Rental Housing Code would include locally enforceable standards that address issues such as the structural integrity of the building, plumbing, adequate heating, weatherproofing, security and other life safety issues. All enforcement would be complaint generated and would require that tenants provide written notice to the landlord prior to filing a complaint with the City.

The City Council will be holding a public hearing on the proposed Stayton Rental Housing Code on Monday, November 7, starting at 7:00 p.m. at the Stayton Community Center. The hearing will be your opportunity to learn more about the proposed Code and provide the City Council with your opinion regarding the Code.

Four Stayton Police Vehicles Now Equipped with AEDs

The Stayton Police Department is pleased to announce implementation of new equipment. In an effort to get emergency medical aid started with the first responders and increase the possibility of saving lives, the Stayton Fire District has generously donated four Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) to the Stayton Police Department. Officers have received training and the new AEDs have been added to four Stayton Police Department patrol cars.



As a result of this important partnership, Stayton Police Department, Stayton Fire District, and Santiam Ambulance will all respond simultaneously to cardiac arrest emergencies in order to start lifesaving care as soon as possible and increase survival of cardiac events. By continuing our close partnership, Stayton's first responders are now even better prepared to answer the call of the community in the event of sudden cardiac arrest.

AED Total Solution provided these staggering statistics regarding sudden cardiac arrest:

- Sudden cardiac arrest is a leading cause of death in the United States, accounting for estimated 325,000 deaths each year.
- 50% of victims of sudden cardiac arrest have no prior symptoms, and many have no previous history of heart disease.
- For each minute that passes without defibrillation and CPR, the chance of survival from sudden cardiac arrest decreases by 7-10%.
- In sudden cardiac arrest, brain death occurs within 4 to 6 minutes of victim's collapse.
- If the necessary lifesaving equipment and first aid does not arrive in time, typical survival rates are only 2 to 5%.
