SUBJECT: Public Works Monthly Operating Report- September 2019

KEY ACTIVITIES

STATUS

- **WWTP Facility** Effluent flows: 32.03 million gallons were treated during September. The highest Daily flow was 1.37 million gallons on the 20th and the lowest flow was 0.76 million gallons on the 4th. The average flow was 1.07 million gallons. Total rainfall for August was 4.27 inches. Biosolids produced were 21.14 Dry Tons and 4 1/2 yards of Biosolids were given away in August and 0 - 5 gallon buckets.
- **WTP** Highest production day was 5,639,000 gallons on September 1, 2019.
- **Water System** Abandoned a water service on Fifth Ave. Cleaned water filter bed #1. Replaced 4 meters and repaired a register. Replaced two radio readers.
- **Streets** 198 curb miles swept and 54 cubic yards of material was removed from the streets. 60 cubic yards of sweeping material was hauled to Coffin Butte. Replaced one street sign to bring up to standard.
- **Parks** Student Volunteers: 12 Regis Student Volunteers, Total # of hours = 48
Parks Board: Total # of Volunteers = 3, Total # of hours = 3
