**Stayton Library Presents Oregon Author
Ron Miner
Thursday, December 8, 2016**

The Stayton Public Library is excited to announce a visit featuring Oregon author Ron Miner on Thursday, Dec 8, 2016 at 7:00 pm in the E. G. Siegmund Meeting Room. There will be a wine and cheese reception accompanying the event.



When Ron Miner's father passed away in 2011, they uncovered a magical trove of artwork, writing,

photos, and memorabilia of all shapes and sizes from his time in the navy during World War II, much of which had been unknown. Howard Miner was one of the

Navy's Black Cats, PBV pilots who flew at night, without lights, in planes painted entirely black. In *Sketches of a Black Cat* we are treated to a behind the scenes look at training and tours of duty in WWII's South Pacific through his eyes, words, and artwork. Ron Miner will present his story of discovery and delve into his father's two tours of duty as a seaplane/rescue pilot.



All The Light We Cannot See

Marie Laure lives with her father in Paris. When she is six, she goes blind, and her father builds her a model of their neighborhood, every house, every manhole, so she can memorize it with her fingers and navigate the real streets. When the Germans occupy Paris, father and daughter flee to Saint-Malo on the Brittany coast. In another world in Germany, an orphan boy, Werner, grows up with his younger sister, Jutta, both enchanted by a crude radio Werner finds. He becomes a master at building and fixing radios, a talent that wins him a place at an elite and brutal military academy and makes him a highly specialized tracker of the Resistance. Werner travels through the heart of Hitler Youth, and into Saint-Malo, where his path converges with Marie-Laure.

Friends of the Library Annual Letter

Dear Friends,

We have been busy making money for our library this year. The highlights are:

Our Used Bookstore - earned about \$1,000 a month

April used book sale - \$3,319

October used book sale - \$4,179

Internet sales - \$1,153

Sale book shelves in the library \$1,125

We also sold handmade bookmarks and tote bags.

With this money, we have purchased children's books, 3 computers, 1 printer, expenses for copy machine, 2 Cultural Passes and movie licenses, newborn baby books, expenses for the children's Summer Reading Program, the teen/tween Summer Reading Program, and the Adult Summer Reading Program. Also, we purchased treats for all the special children's programs throughout the year, supplies, honorariums and food for the author visits, and book kits for the Book Club. I'm sure I'm forgetting something.

We also took part in community events such as Summerfest, the Christmas Bazaar, and the Library Foundation Father/Daughter Ball (we purchased books to giveaway.)

We have been working on raising money for an electric sign for the front of the library. It will be for announcing non-profit community events. So far, we have raised \$4,950 but need \$12,050 more. If anyone has ideas on how to raise this amount, give us a call or mention it to someone in the library.

The FOL has 28 lifetime members and 33 paid members. We need more active people so we can continue raising this kind of money. We meet on the third Monday of the month, Jan-June. If you are a member but haven't paid your dues, please do. We also need help with the following: once a week moving boxes of books to our storage container next to the Community Center; people to work in the bookstore; and more people to work on the April and October sales. You can bring friends and family to help too.

We also need people to serve on the Library Board. This group also meets once a month. Call Janna, our new Library Director, if you are willing or you know someone who is willing to serve.

Our annual meeting is December 19. Please come to the library at 11:00. We are going to have a cookie exchange. Bring 2 dozen cookies and go home with 2 dozen different cookies. It's also your chance to vote for the 2017 panel of officers that the group has nominated.

Merry Christmas and I hope you all will have a healthy new year.




