Ida Street Sanitary Sewer Project & Future Phases

For all those wondering, there is an end in sight for the construction work on West Ida Street! The Ida Street Sanitary Sewer Project is progressing smoothly and is expected to be completed by the end of the year. Currently, the project has installed approximately 2,000 feet of 30-inch sewer pipe, nearly doubling the capacity of the previous sewer pipe. This significant improvement will address existing and future capacity issues and accommodate the area's growing development.

This project marks the second phase of the downtown sanitary sewer upgrades. Improvement will continue for the downtown area, with planning already underway for the next phase. Future work will involve installing expanded sewer lines from Ida Street to 1st Avenue and then extend the line north to Marion Street, laying the groundwork for the next phase.

The project has been made possible thanks to federal funding provided by the ARPA (America Rescue Plan Act) and SLFRF (State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds). It is also thanks to State grants we were awarded earlier this year, that we are able to swiftly move forward with the next phases.

The final step in the project is the paving of the street once the construction is complete. The timelines for this are heavily dependent on temperature, weather, and timing so we are thankful to the community for your understanding and patience through this process.

Street Fees Adjustments



Starting in January, adjustments to the street fee will go into effect to provide much-needed funding for city streets. This increase is part of a comprehensive strategy adopted by Council that also includes more general fund dollars going to street improvements and actively seeking outside and alternate funding sources.

This increase in street fees will address the growing demand for maintenance and improvements. Previously, funding levels were insufficient, leading to a backlog of deferred maintenance and a rise in future costs

Street fee adjustments will appear in February's utility bill.
