## Street Sweeper Schedule

As a reminder the City's Street Sweeper will be sweeping daily until the end of December. Sweeping will be West of 1st Ave. Monday & Tuesday, and East of First Ave. Thursday and Friday.

Leaves and other debris should never be blown or placed in the road. Remove garbage cans from road and remove non-operating vehicles, sports equipment, and other objects that may block the sweeper from sweeping your neighborhood's curb.
