In October, eighty-nine children, parents, and caregivers joined Jennifer, Shelby, and Nicole for a special harvest-themed storytime at Fordyce Farm. Afterwards, we gave out free books, and families explored the farm. The Friends of the Library Used Book Sale made \$5,990.50 and had a record-breaking opening night. We are so grateful to Laurie, Pam, Jolene and Mary for spearheading it. Thank you to all of our amazing volunteers who gave their time and effort for the sale.

Jennifer, Janna, Nicole and Shelby held STEAM days after school every day for a week. Participants of all ages plugged into the world of robotics with our selection of Ozobots and Cubelets and even built their own robots. We celebrated stories and storytelling at our Story-Palooza. Thank you to Melanie for helping at our event. Jennifer introduced a Librarian for a Day program, which gives patrons an opportunity to work with a staff member to create a display around the books they enjoy and want to share with the community. So far, we have had four excited Librarians for a day. Evie facilitated a teen meetup and volunteer opportunity, our teens helped paint decor for our Halloween event, and Jennifer and Janna provided activities at Stayton Elementary School's Literacy Night.

One hundred and sixty-eight people joined us for pumpkin painting. Over 70 of the painted pumpkins stayed at the Library to be part of our pumpkin voting contest. Jennifer, Janna, and Evie provided stories, tours and pumpkin voting for Stayton Elementary School's second-grade walking field trip. Fifty people joined Stephanie and Janna for our DIY Craftshop program to make haunted bookshelves. Fiber arts enthusiasts of all ages and abilities brought a project they are working on or tried a new one with Rachel and Nicole at our Fiber Arts Connection. Adults met for book club with Stephanie to discuss *The Diamond Eye* by Kate Quinn.

Janna represented Stayton at the Polk, Yamhill and Marion (PYM) Library Directors meeting. Jennifer represented us at the PYM Children's Services meeting, and Evie and Janna represented us at the PYM Circulation meeting.
